

5 Steps to U.S. Study

With thousands of accredited U.S. colleges and universities in the United States, how do you find the one that is right for you? EducationUSA Advisers offer information, orientation, and guidance as you search for higher education institutions in the United States that fit your needs.

1. Research Your Options (At least 18-24 Months before U.S. Study)

- Take academically challenging courses
- · Gain research/work experience
- Plan to complete a 4-year degree (or 3 years, plus Honour's to be eligible for admission into U.S. Master's programs
- Attend a free EducationUSA introductory session
- Note admission tests, professors, and how to prepare
- Contact U.S. University Departments & Professors regarding questions not answered on their websites

2. Finance Your Studies (12-18 mos.)

- Develop a budget & find ways to reduce costs
- · Search for scholarships & other financial aid

3. Complete Your Application (9-12 mos.)

- Manage application timelines
- Tackle application requirements, (i.e. required tests, transcripts, recommendations)
- Write & re-write statement of purpose

4. Apply For Your Student Visa (3-5 mos.)

- Outline the visa application process
- Feel prepared for your interview

5. Prepare For Your Departure (2-4 mos.)

- Attend a free EducationUSA Pre-Departure Orientation
- Know what to expect when you arrive & ease into your new environment

Other U.S. Government Sponsored Exchanges

Fulbright Foreign Student Program

Provides Grants for South African university graduates to pursue a Master's or Doctoral degree at a United States university in any subject (excludes studies that require contact with patients). Grants are awarded for two years towards one degree – Master's or Doctorate (renewable each year). Students are selected through a rigorous application and interview process and receive a high level of support ranging from visa processing and health insurance to a comprehensive pre-departure Orientation and re-entry session.

Fulbright African Research Scholar Program (ARSP)

is an opportunity for a South African University Faculty or Research Institute Professionals to conduct research in their field of expertise at a U.S. Academic or Research Institution for a period of 3 to 9 months. A research grant enables the scholar to perform high-level research at a U.S. educational institution, aimed at strengthening academic programs or curricula at his/her home institution. Applicants need to have a proven track record of productive scholarly research, and publications.

Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowships

Provides 10 months of professional enrichment and non-degree graduate-level study in the U.S. for accomplished mid-level professionals.
